CREC's Leadership Academy offers young leaders in local high schools an unparalleled opportunity to develop and practice leadership in an authentic and meaningful way.



#### **About CRILA**

The Capitol Region Interdistrict Leadership Academy (CRILA) is a program created and operated by the Capitol Region Education Council (CREC) through an interdistrict grant from the Connecticut State Department of Education. CRILA's stated mission "is to provide a diverse forum whereby students will practice ethical and collaborative leadership through research and community services."

CRILA enrolls approximately thirty students from the thirty-five Greater Hartford school districts in a year long program that begins in the students' sophomore or junior year and extends through the following school year.

### **Outward Bound Experience**

Members of the Leadership Academy begin the program at the end of their sophomore or junior year by traveling to the Colorado Outward Bound Wilderness School in Leadville, Colorado. While at Outward Bound, students develop collaborative leadership skills by hiking, rock climbing, participating in ropes courses, and problem solving team and individual challenges. The Outward Bound experience serves to build a lifelong bond between members of the academy.

### Academic Course in Leadership

During the academic school year, students in the Leadership Academy attend monthly class sessions in the evenings or on the weekends where they conduct a rigorous academic study of leadership. The academic study is enriched through guest speakers from a variety of fields ranging from business to education to the military. These speakers have proven themselves to be leaders in their organizations and in their communities.

### **The Community Service Project**

The Leadership Academy's culminating experience is a student-created community service project designed to have a positive impact on the Greater Hartford region. Students are required to complete extensive reading in the area of leadership, write a culminating reflective paper, and support the successful execution of the community service project.



### **Eligibility Information**

Students completing their sophomore and junior years are invited to apply. Student must be from one of the 36 participating towns in the Hartford region.

There is no cost to students or their schools for participation in the CRILA program.

Students receive Honors elective credit for the course.
